Dear Friends,

Kenya is still suffering from many political issues that started after the last election. Tensions are still present, and many people are displaced and living in camps. A drought has been a problem all over the country, and it is severely affecting food production. Electricity rationing that started several months ago has now become permanent. The rationing of water has been in place in Nairobi for some time. People receive water only one day a week or no water at all for several days in some parts of the city. Against this backdrop, The Outreach Foundation is continuing to work with partners in



East Africa. The Presbyterian Church of East Africa (PCEA) has a new church leadership in which we are already excited about working with. We continue to work in partnership with PCEA in four main areas: church construction, school construction, drilling boreholes and minister/evangelist training.

So far in 2009, we have partnered with PCEA in constructing seven churches in Kenya and one in Uganda. This was the first church for PCEA in Uganda, and we are looking forward to a dedication celebration in Kampala in late November. We continue to reach out to more remote areas. We have also constructed several new schools. Two of the schools were built in the Kibera slum, the largest slum in Africa. One of the facilities was an eight room vocational school and the other was a much needed high school. We also continue building onto Kimuka Girls' High School which will soon become the largest girls' high school with over 300 students. Another notable school that was just started was the Pwani High School, the first Christian high school in the coastal area. By the end of the year, we will have completed ten schools.

We continue to support the evangelist/tentmakers course through the Millimani Presbytery held in the Maasai Land. This program has already trained 30 evangelists and tentmakers this year.

We have completed one borehole at Ilkeek and have two more at Kimuka and Karai, which are almost complete.

We look forward to working with PCEA in 2010 and expanding the kingdom throughout East Africa. We thank you for the support and prayers throughout the year.
