Stewardship for Life: A Season of Giving



Stewardship *giving from the heart* unlocks the secrets of charitable giving and makes it simpler to make giving your way of life – your lifestyle.

The 2010 Season of Giving Devotional is a great way to prayerfully shape your heart.

Why give? Stewardship, the giving of our time, talents and financial gifts, is a natural expression of our relationship with God. We are to give God “the supremacy” in everything (Col 1:18). There is not a starting or a finish line for giving – it all belongs to God. Not just our money, our home, our car, but everything! You cannot lose anything that you give to God since He owns it all (1Cor 4:7).

When to give? Give God back his portion first.

How much? Give liberally. “Whoever sows generously will also reap generously (2 Cor 9:6). Since everything we have belongs to Him, it is impossible to place a limit on gifts when we are giving things of eternal value. Stewardship giving is not limited, as God’s love is not limited “...for God is love.” (1 John 4:8).

Giving doesn’t just happen. Most of do not give as much as we should because we don’t plan our giving. We may need to make some tough financial, time and action decisions in order to have the freedom to give more. We may need to reduce our debt or create options to live a simpler life. We may have to budget ourselves. It means we have to pray for creating and understanding the value of our priorities. We, as stewards of all God’s gifts, pray and follow our hearts to give what God wants us to give.
